OUR CHIEF END

Dear members & friends of Pinnacle:

Did you know that you have a "Chief End"? Well you do... Let me explain!

We are told this in our Presbyterian Book of Confessions in the Shorter Catechism. Its format is a question and an answer:

- Q.** What is the chief end of humankind?
- A.** Humankind's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy God forever.

This simple question and answer is a wonderful thing to meditate on as we approach Thanksgiving.

So what does "chief end," mean? This phrase raises the questions: Where is my focus? And, what am I about?

In every action we take or in every resource we use there is an opportunity for us to ask, "Does this action glorify God?" The shorter Catechism gives us the steep challenge that our main goal in life is to glorify God.

What if each of us, just for a moment, once a day, could remember that this was our "chief end"? I think it would make a difference in the actions we would take at work, with family, at school, at home or when we spend our money.

But the phrase doesn't stop there. It continues with: "and to enjoy God forever."

What a wonderfully unique phrase. Have you ever thought about how you "enjoy God"?

If we credit God with giving us life and all the opportunities life offers, then there is much to enjoy about God. If we shift our thinking from "I deserve (fill in the blank)" to "I have been gifted this minute or this hour or this day to (fill in the blank)," I believe it becomes easier to enjoy God

PINNACLE VOLUNTEERS RETURN TO NEW ORLEANS

This year's Home for Christmas mission trip to New Orleans was fantastic, says Rev. Kristin Willett.

Eleven men and women from our congregation were joined by four from Orange-wood Presbyterian for a week of rebuilding in New Orleans. Our team was split into two groups and each was assigned a work site.



"The work was strenuous but we were blessed to get to know the owners of the homes we were rebuilding," Pastor Kristin says.

One house belonged to a husband and wife who faced more than just rebuilding. The wife was going through chemotherapy to treat breast cancer, and her husband had been in a bad car accident and was awaiting neck and back surgery. The owners of the other house were also facing medical and health challenges. The husband was on dialysis and awaiting a kidney transplant.

Despite illnesses and challenges they have faced since the storm, both families were optimistic and showed our group warm hospitality.

In addition to Pastor Kristin, also on the mission trip were Doug Brown, Roy Gust, Linda Jenkins, John King, Mark Leinweber, Dirk Oosterwyk, Jeannie Oosterwyk, Carl Richie, Mary Lou Roof, Dan Sherwood, Lucile Sherwood, Stephanie Webster, Brandon Willett and Lisa Wills.

NEW CONSTRUCTION TAKING SHAPE

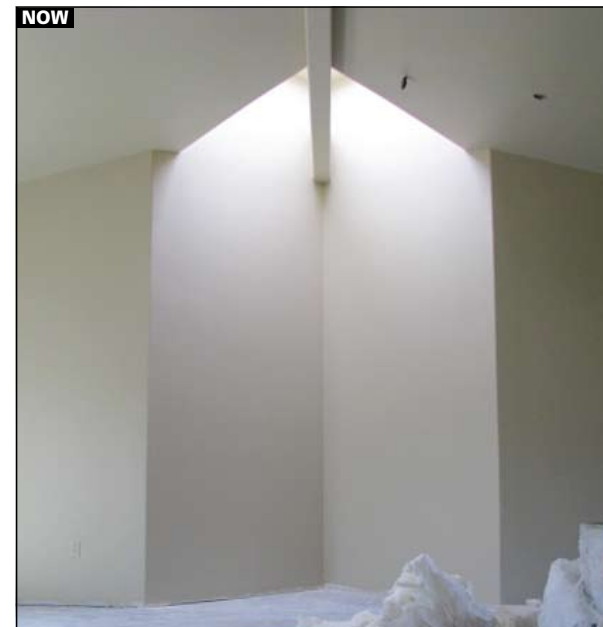


Throughout the dust, noise and clutter, the new Youth Center and additions to the offices and Fellowship Hall are taking shape and well on the road to completion.
